NON-SPONSORED EVENTS/ ACTIVITIES AND DISTRICT RISK

Often, ASCIP is asked about the district's liability associated with non-sponsored events or activities.

Non-sponsored events/activities are field trips, outings, or other ventures that are **not** district approved, sponsored or recognized. Examples include:

- Taking students to destinations that are not authorized or approved by the district
- Activities that do not meet educational mission
- Activities that are conducted outside of school hours or school year
- Activities that are privately funded
- District staff are not involved in evaluating the trip's acceptability, safety issues, or insurance requirements



Teachers, faculty, coaches and employees (hereinafter referred to as "staff") engaging in non-district sponsored activities must understand they are participating in them at their own risk. They must not use district materials, communication devices, or other resources to promote, plan, organize, or recruit for these activities. Additionally, staff must not use school facilities to host meetings or activities. Failure to do so may attach the district to liability.

Staff must use personal emails and non-work hours to promote, plan, organize, and coordinate the trip. In addition, staff must adhere to the district's use of facility policy for meetings or planning events held on district premises. Finally, participants and parents must be informed that the event/activity is not district sponsored or endorsed.
