IMPROVE YOUR SAFETY MEETINGS

Ways to make your meetings more meaningful

Lead & Believe- A strong leader presence is critical to a successful meeting. The participants will see that you believe in the message and that they should as well.

Listen - Be a facilitator of ideas, not a lecturer. Ask questions that engage people as well as promote conversation.

Conduct Roving Safety Meetings – To make a safety meeting more engaging and interactive consider performing a “Hazard Hunt” - a roving tailgate meeting. Each person is involved in locating potential unsafe conditions/hazards at a prearranged workstation or job site.

Change the Leader– Rotating safety-meeting leaders gets everyone involved in addition to promoting the ownership of ideas.

Focus on People, Not Policy – The meeting's message should include culture as well as compliance. People are more likely to respond to a safety message when the focus is on what matters most to them.
