## Identifying Single-User Restrooms as All-Gender

Per Health and Safety Code Section 118600, single-user restrooms must be identified as all-gender and comply with California signage standards.

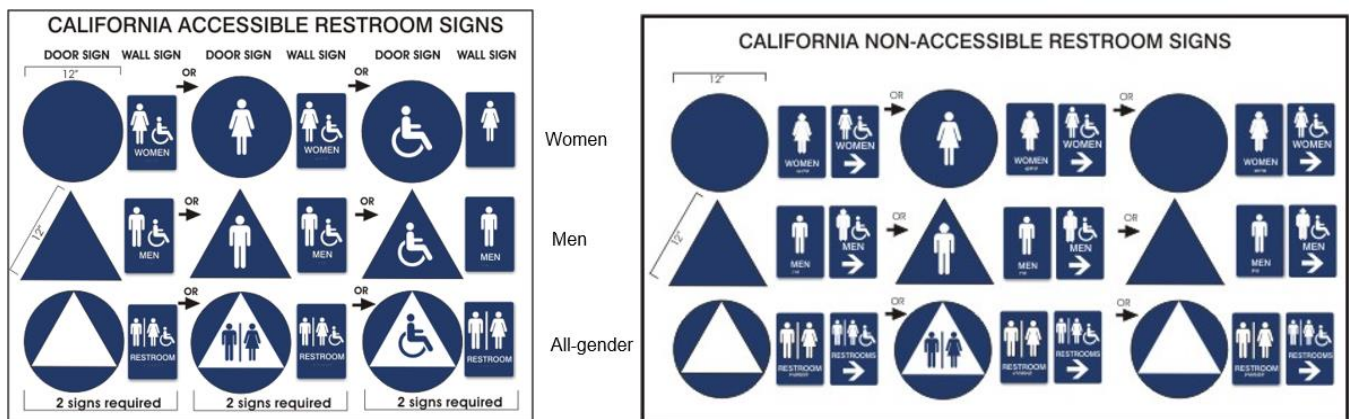
### Health and Safety Code Section 118600

- All single-user toilet facilities in any business establishment, place of public accommodation, or state or local government agency are to be:
  - identified as all-gender by signage that complies with Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations, and
  - designated for use by no more than one occupant at a time, for family, or assisted-use.
- An inspector or official responsible for code enforcement may inspect for compliance with this section.
- For this section, a “single-user toilet facility” means a toilet facility with no more than one water closet and one urinal with a locking mechanism controlled by the user.

### California Building Code (CBC)

CBC Chapter 11B, *Accessibility to Public Buildings, Public Accommodations, Commercial Buildings, and Public Housing*, provides the requirements for door geometric symbols and wall signs that identify toilet facilities. For door geometric symbols, scoping provisions may be found at 11B, 216.8, and technical requirements at 11B, 703.7.2.6.
