# PREVENTING SLIPS, TRIPS, AND FALLS

Slips, trips, and falls are often overlooked hazards in any workplace, yet they account for a significant number of injuries every year. Whether it's a slick floor, an uneven surface, or an obstacle in our path, these incidents can happen in an instant, affecting anyone from employees to visitors. Recognizing the importance of maintaining a safe environment is crucial in preventing such accidents. Let's take a proactive approach to identify and mitigate potential risks, ensuring that each step we take is a safe one.



#### **Follow Safe Practices:**

## Faculty, Teachers & Staff

- ⇒ When working beyond your reach, use a stepladder or request help. Do not stand on a chair.
- ⇒ Wear slip-resistant footwear when wet conditions exist.
- ⇒ Obey caution signs during floor maintenance or construction projects.
- □ Identify and remove or report tripping hazards.
- ⇒ Clean up spills immediately or report spills and request assistance from the custodial team.

#### **Custodians and Maintenance Personnel**

- □ Use caution and wear slip resistant footwear when cleaning, stripping or waxing floors.
- ⇒ Ensure floor mats are positioned correctly and are in good condition.
- ⇒ Perform regular inspections of walking surfaces and submit work orders for repairs.
- □ Inspect loose handrails, damaged stair treads, cracked surfaces and mark them with caution signs until repairs can be completed.
- ⇒ Use the proper ladder or step stool for the job. Do not stand on a chair or desk to extend your reach.
- ⇒ Avoid trailing cables along the floor from equipment and tools.

### **Identify Hazardous Conditions**

- ⇔ Check for loose, damaged, worn and uneven flooring. Submit the findings for repair.

- ⇒ Ensure steps are marked with anti-slip nosing and not a gloss paint that is slippery when wet.
